

Editorial from the Church of the Good Shepherd June 2020

Teach us to pray...

A recent survey suggested that the COVID-19 crisis has led a lot of people to pray, many for the first time, as we all try to make sense of what is happening. An often asked question within church communities is, 'how should I pray?' There are lots of possible answers, with lots of different ways to pray and any way is better than not at all. But, when Jesus's disciples asked Him to, "teach us to pray" He gave them the words that we traditionally call the Lord's Prayer. That seems a good place to start a prayer journey.

Our Father. For some, that's a helpful, comforting place to begin. Father can bring images of provider, protector, someone who loves us. This is not true for everyone and it might not be how you see God at the moment. So maybe start with Mother or Friend, Sister or Brother, or perhaps for you God is currently Stranger or even Enemy. Prayer is often described as a conversation, so be honest about who you are talking to – God already knows how you feel, you won't hurt His feelings with your honesty.

Hallowed be your name. For a moment consider putting God at the centre. The focus of your love, your praise, your life, or maybe your anger, your pain, your fear – God is big enough to handle it all.

Your kingdom come, your will be done on earth. Imagine what the world would be like if God's kingdom, if heaven, was fully here! What needs to change for that to happen? That might be a very long list, so, what is the most immediate need, the one you're closest to? What needs to change in you for God's kingdom to rest with you? What is God inviting you to change in the world?

Give us today our daily bread. What do you need for today? Not for tomorrow, or next year. Do you have what you need for today? Ask God to help you be just in today, to see what you truly need and also to let go of worries for the future.

Forgive us, as we forgive. What are the things that separate us from God?, Although Jesus dealt with them on the cross, do we still hold on to them? What do we need to let go of from our past? And what separates us from other people that we need to let go of?

Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Perhaps the most basic of prayers, 'Help me!' 'Save me!' 'When the world tempts me to walk away from you God, help me!' 'When the world is against me, save me!.'

It's not necessary to say the whole prayer all together, perhaps stay with one of two lines for a while and see what they are saying to you. I've also seen a suggestion for reversing the order of the words, starting with 'Save me' and working backwards to discover at the end who it is we are praying to; are we led to 'Our Father'? As human beings, created in God's image, I believe that prayer is as natural as breathing. Like breathing, however, sometimes we need a bit of help. Notes from Borough Green Parish Council

The Parish Council met at 7.30pm on Monday 4th May 2020 online with the authority of The Local Authorities & Police & Crime Panels Regulations 2020 No.392. Matters discussed and reports received included:

- Bernie Galopin attended his first meeting in his role as Parish Clerk. Bernie can be contacted by email at **clerk@boroughgreen.gov.uk** or call **07568 536405**.
- Whilst the Corona Virus lockdown continues, members of the public can email queries and comments to the Clerk, and they will be included in the public section of the meeting.
- The Playground Revamp Project is investigating 3 more tenders for a full revamp, and will be applying for Lottery Funding.
- The Council is investigating surfacing the footpath through the Recreation Ground, and possibly extending it on the East side to make a continuous surfaced path, so people can still exercise in wet weather.
- After almost a year we have finally managed to "regularise" our accounts with the Natwest Bank, which should allow us to return to some measure of online banking, and now have 5 signatories. We require two signatories for our cheques, and they are cross checked against the payments and invoices.
- We now have a PO Box mail address, which protects the Clerk's privacy, but most importantly allows us to divert mail in an instant without having to notify all our suppliers. The address is: **PO Box 635 Sevenoaks TN13 9UX**.
- We have just been notified that Tonbridge & Malling Council are withholding their Annual Contribution to the Basted Mill Open Space Committee, and so Borough Green and Platt PCs have both voted to withhold theirs.
- Many local charities who do important work in and for the village have had their funding cut, and so the Parish Council decided to award grants from its reserves to Heart of Kent Hospice, Red Cross, West Kent Mediation, The Lionesses Luncheon Club, the BG Village Hall, Home-Start, Spadework and Citizen's Advice.
- The Parish Council as a body wanted to formally thank Wrotham Parish Clerk, Lesley Cox, for her unstinting support and help over the past year, her work in preparing our annual accounts, her ongoing help in training our new Clerk.
- The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held **online** 7.30pm on **Monday1st June 2020**. The agenda will include a period for public comment, and residents are welcome to email or post comments and questions to the Clerk.
- The Annual Parish Council meeting that elects the Chairmen and appoints committees, has been deferred until our first physical meeting. Members will continue in post until that day.
- The Annual Parish Meeting, an opportunity for all village organisations and clubs to tell residents what their group does has been cancelled.

How we're working now: To ensure that we can continue to deal with as many patients as possible, we've been advised by the government that general practice should move to telephone and online consultations where possible. This helps to minimise the number of people who are physically coming into the practice. Please do not come to the practice unless we have telephoned you and told you to come.

The practice will continue to have processes to ensure childhood immunisation and other essential care continues.

If you are seen at the surgery your clinician may need to wear gloves, gown, eye protectionmask so do not be alarmed. Our clinicians will also need to wear this protection on home visits. It does not indicate the person they are visiting has coronavirus it is just the precautions they must take.

Reception: With the difficulties we're currently facing, telephone lines may be busier than normal, so to try to help, we've compiled a list of common queries. In addition, many mobile phone network providers have said they'll allow free access to NHS websites so that you can find the most up-to-date information about coronavirus while it's an issue for the UK.

What if I need my regular medication? In the first instance, we'd ask you to order repeat medication via our website or the NHS app. Please be aware that although we're processing requests as quickly as we can, the level of demand is placing the system under pressure and pharmacies may not be able to order medication quite as quickly as normal due to the volume of requests. You can order your repeat medication when you have 7 days remaining of your current prescription.

Severely vulnerable patients: SHIELDING EXTREMELY VULNERABLE PATIENTS As you may be aware the government have sent over a million letters to patients advising them that they are in a 'severely vulnerable at risk' group and should isolate for the next 12 weeks. These letters were produced using hospital data and not data from GP Practices. As a result the government announced that the GP practices will be writing to additional patients. As you may have noticed, there has been a delay in this process centrally by NHS England / NHS Digital. We have been informed that we can now send the additional letters to those patients we have identified as meeting the criteria to be in the shielded group. These will have been sent by 15 April at the latest.we have your mobile number we will text you to tell you the letter is on its way.

Following receipt of your letter you will receive a phone call from our social prescriber asking if you need any help during your isolation such as collecting shopping or prescriptions. You can also contact the NHS volunteer service to access help - 0808 196 3382.

Prescriptions from Lloyds Pharmacy

Thanks to the efforts of volunteers, and the staff of Lloyds Pharmacy, prescriptions continue to be delivered automatically to all who are aged 70 or over. For others who would like delivery because they are self-isolating or vulnerable, requests can be made by telephone to Lloyds (01732 884218) - details of exemptions need to be provided. If payment is required arrangements should be made for someone to collect prescriptions.

The school is partially re-opening on 1 June and we will be facing new challenges with some year groups while still missing those pupils who are learning at home. Transitioning out of lockdown is a brand new journey for schools, unmapped,



into unchartered territory, but the thought of being together again and of immersing ourselves once more in the wonder of learning and exploration is enough to fuel us for the adventure. Year 6, our oldest learners, will be once again roaming our corridors but this time with even more regulation and safety in mind. Of course, for this special year group there is more than one transition on their minds as they prepare for leaving primary school and embarking on the next part of their journeys at various secondary schools. These pupils may be visiting their new schools but if they do it will be in much smaller groups than usual.

As well as our leavers being back in school, our youngest pupils will also be with us again – Reception and Year 1 pupils will be returning to school with lots of opportunities to stretch and grow their learning muscles in our outdoor spaces: the meadow, nature area, and playgrounds.

For teachers, the lockdown experience has required us to also stretch and grow our learning muscles as we teach in new ways and use technology to communicate from a distance. Our weekly phone calls to our pupils has eased the pain of separation and brought a new element to teacher-pupil relationships; an unexpected pleasure has been the way even young pupils have developed the art of the phone conversation. Another joy has been when pupils have sent us photographs or even videos of their work; the way each household interprets tasks differently and completes them with their own brand of creativity has been wonderful.

Of course we are all desperate to get back to normal, to have our corridors, classrooms and playgrounds busy again, to greet our classes every morning and send them home tired but happy every afternoon. Teachers miss the buzz of a room of 30 pupils all grappling with a task and applying their combined efforts and individual minds. Many even miss the sense of anticipation when opening a book to mark a pupil's work. We all miss the energy of a P.E. lesson, the spellbound atmosphere of a whole school assembly and the magic of 30 pupils temporarily visiting 30 different imaginative worlds when reading their books for 10 minutes after the frenetic joy of lunchtime play. One day all this will be ours again and no doubt we will treasure it more for having lost it for a while.

Launch of New Mental Wellbeing Support Info Hub



(Press release issued on 30 April)

Health partners and providers, local authorities and emergency services across Kent and Medway are working together to provide information on local support services to help people's mental wellbeing during the ongoing Coronavirus Covid-19) pandemic crisis.

Information is available at www.kent.gov.uk/wellbeing for people experiencing bereavement and loss, debt and financial difficulties, pregnant women and new mums needing extra support, families looking for help with young children or teenagers.

There is support for those who might already have pre-existing mental health conditions, are victims of domestic abuse or are people in the shielded community. The site also offers help for people with learning disabilities, people who don't use English as a first language, carers and NHS staff, care staff and other key workers.

Kent County Council Director of Public Health, Andrew Scott-Clark said: "The challenging reality of lockdown is creating uncertainty and anxiety for many. The constant news can feel overwhelming and you may be adjusting to a different way of life, with children off school, many people not working or working from home, as well as not seeing family, friends and colleagues. This anxiety is natural, and we are all feeling it. Fortunately, there are things that we can do to protect our mental health and to support the wellbeing of our friends and family. At www.kent.gov.uk/wellbeing you can find information, advice and signposting to other great sites which can help, whatever your situation and need. This is #kenttogether."

As part of the Release the Pressure campaign, a new text service is now available – by texting the word "Kent" or "Medway" to 85258, you will start a conversation with one of the many trained and experienced volunteers who can give support at any time, wherever you are. It's a place to go if you're struggling to cope and you need immediate help. Texts are free on all major mobile networks and the service is provided by SHOUT and the Crisis Text Line.

The service will run in addition to the current 24/7 freephone helpline and is funded by the Kent and Medway Sustainability and Transformation

Partnership (STP) which is a collaboration between Kent County Council, Medway Council, Kent and Medway NHS and Social Care Partnership Trust and all the NHS organisations across Kent and Medway.

Vulnerable people in Kent who need urgent help, supplies or medication are also reminded of the helpline – called **Kent Together** – which provides a single, convenient point of contact for anyone in the county who is in urgent need of help during the Coronavirus outbreak. It is a collaboration between KCC, central Government, District, Borough and local councils, the voluntary and community sector, the NHS and other partners to ensure help is at hand for vulnerable people.

From Your County Councillor

This month I will take the opportunity to address the subject of highways for which Kent County Council has responsibility throughout Kent, except in the Medway Council area and for Motorways, which are the responsibility of Highways England. There are particular trunk A Roads including the A21, which are



also maintained by Highways England. Linked to highways, KCC has some responsibility in connection with public transport, which I shall touch on later in this column.

Over recent weeks the opportunity has been taken by many of the public and private utility companies to undertake such daytime work as would in normal circumstances lead to major road traffic delays. With so many private vehicles removed from the highway network KCC Highways has encouraged utilities and their roadwork contractors to undertake any works that can be scheduled to be undertaken during this time. This is a means to pro-actively manage the road network to the benefit of all.

I have sought to actively encourage highways work to be undertaken in my division, especially on the A20 London Road in Wrotham, where the water egress from the Spring Tavern site has now been undertaken by contractors to KCC Highways, arrangements for cost recovery from the landowner is in hand. Users of Common Road, Ightham will I hope be as pleased as residents, following the repairs to drainage. Further works to drainage issues to follow shortly in south west Hildenborough.

I sometimes receive correspondence from those seeking speed restrictions, road improvements, changes to on-street vehicle parking or more and occasionally less street furniture. Arrangements are now in hand for such matters to be considered when parish councils prepare their own local highway and transport plans. KCC highways will then try to use these where possible in order to bring about the types of improvements that residents seek.

Public Transport

Three words that cause concern regarding the upcoming return to work are "avoiding public transport" if possible. This continues to put pressure on many commercial bus operators and must be balanced with the need for them in the long term, as part of the most efficient use of road space, again in the future. In the meantime, commercial and subsidised bus operations continue where possible. Clearly there are some significant challenges ahead in terms of social distancing, depending on circumstances, particularly once arrangements are put in hand to open secondary schools.

Further information is expected on how public transport will have to operate once the current restrictions are eased. At the same time school reopening and future transport needs remain unclear at the time of writing in mid -May.

LOCAL PLAN HEARINGS

The Planning Inspectorate issued general guidance on Covid-19 and Local Plan Examinations on 13 May (including the following extract).

The recent Written Ministerial Statement (WMS) sets out the Government's expectations for how the planning system should be operating under the Covid-19 restrictions. The WMS states that moving to digital events and processes will be critical to drive the planning process forward and that Government expects Inspectors to take decisions about whether and how virtual events should proceed and to consider the practical measures needed to ensure fair participation

We are currently working with two local authorities to trial holding local plan hearing sessions as digital events (by video/telephone conference). We will look at phasing this in for other local plan examinations, building on the experience from digital pilots across the organisation and elsewhere

We will be asking Inspectors to explore with local authorities and Programme Officers how each current examination can best move forward ensuring fair participation. For some examinations this may mean moving ahead with virtual hearings. For others, where the hearings are likely to be programmed for autumn, it may involve provisionally arranging hearing sessions and then reviewing how these would be best be run in the light of any forthcoming changes in Government guidance on Covid-19.

We will have to wait to see what decisions are taken about the postponed hearing on TMBC's Local Plan (including the proposed extensive housing development for Borough Green Gardens). Updates should appear on the Council's website - TMBC Local Plan examination Latest News and Updates



TMBC has installed an Air Quality Monitor at the Western Road/Sevenoaks Road roundabout. It will be there for at least a year to collect data on the quality of air that we are breathing in - the level of Particulate Matter (PM 10) that can end up in our lungs.
